WHEN YOU GROW WEARY, KEEP DOING GOOD: *“Don’t Quit the Work”*

⁷Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap. ⁸For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting. ⁹And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not. ¹⁰As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith. Galatians 6:7-10

Focusing on Galatians 6:9

On Sunday, we were reminded through Galatians 6:7–10, especially verse 9, that God calls us to keep doing good even when we grow weary. The message, “When You Grow Weary, Keep Doing Good,” encouraged us “Do Not Quite The not to quit the work God has placed before us. Weariness is real, but it does not have to have the final word. God sees every seed we sow, every act of kindness, every prayer, every sacrifice, and every step of obedience.

,Paul's words remind us that the harvest belongs to God and comes in His appointed season. Sometimes we may feel like the work is too much, the wait is too long, or the results are too slow. Yet the Word of God assures us that faithful labor is never wasted. If God gave us the assignment, He will also give us the strength to continue.

The sermon also reminded us through the widow of Zarephath, Peter and John at the temple gate, and Jesus at the well that God can use what we have, even when it feels small. The widow gave in faith during famine. Peter and John offered the name of Jesus when they had no silver or gold. Jesus ministered even while weary from the journey. Each example shows us that one act of obedience, one word of encouragement, one prayer, or one willing heart can become a seed God uses for His glory.

For Reflection This Week

- Where have I been tempted to grow weary in doing good?
- What seed has God asked me to keep sowing, even though I have not yet seen the harvest?
- What do I already have in my hands that God can use to bless someone else?
- Who can I encourage, serve, pray for, or help this week?

Encouragement for the Journey

This week, do not measure your faithfulness by what you can see right now. Keep sowing. Keep praying. Keep serving. Keep loving. Keep giving God your yes. The harvest may not come on our timetable, but it will come in God's perfect time. Until then, let us encourage one another and continue to do good whenever God gives us the opportunity.

Don't quit the work. In due season, we shall reap if we do not faint.

Father, thank You for reminding us that our labor in You is not in vain. Strengthen us when we are tired, encourage us when the harvest seems delayed, and help us to keep doing good with faithful hearts. Use what we have, bless what we give, and make our lives a witness to Your goodness. In Jesus' name, Amen.
