**Sermon Series:** Keeping It Real: Real Faith for Real Life

**Sermon Title:** When the Outcome Is Uncertain – June 21, 2026

**Monday Mindset:**

Even though you don't know the ending, you can trust the One who holds the end.

**Scripture**

Daniel 3:1–21 (NKJV)

**Main Scripture**

Daniel 3:16–18 (NKJV)

**Key Thought**

Faith is not trusting God only when the outcome is certain. Real faith trusts God even when the future is unclear.

---

**Overview**

Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego faced a situation with an uncertain outcome. They knew God was able to deliver them from the fiery furnace, but they did not know if He would. Yet they remained faithful.

Their story reminds us that faith is not based on knowing how everything will turn out. It is based on knowing who God is. When life feels uncertain, we can trust God's ability, accept His decision, and remain faithful no matter what comes.

**Point 1**

**Trust God's Ability**

**Scripture**

**Daniel 3:17 (NKJV)**

*"If that is the case, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and He will deliver us from your hand, O king."*

## **Reflection**

The three Hebrew boys had confidence in God's power. They believed that God was able to rescue them from the furnace. Faith begins with recognizing that there is nothing beyond God's ability.

Even when circumstances seem impossible, God's power remains unchanged.

## **Reflection Questions**

Do I believe God is able to handle the situation I am facing?

Am I focusing more on the problem or on God's power?

## **This Week's Application**

Bring your concerns to God in prayer.

Remind yourself of times God has been faithful.

Place your confidence in God's power, not your circumstances.

## **Point 2**

### **Accept God's Decision**

#### **Scripture**

#### **Daniel 3:18a (NKJV)**

*"But if not..."*

## **Reflection**

These three words reveal remarkable faith. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego trusted God's ability, but they also accepted that God's decision might be different from what they desired.

Faith is not demanding that God do what we want. Faith is trusting God even when His answer is different from our expectations.

## **Reflection Questions**

Can I trust God even when His answer is not the one I want?

Am I willing to submit my plans to His wisdom?

## **This Week's Application**

Surrender your expectations to God.

Trust that His wisdom is greater than your understanding.

Choose obedience even when the outcome is unclear.

## **Point 3**

### **Stay Faithful Through the Fire**

#### **Scripture**

##### **Daniel 3:18b (NKJV)**

*"Let it be known to you, O king, that we do not serve your gods, nor will we worship the gold image which you have set up."*

#### **Reflection**

The three Hebrew boys settled their commitment before they entered the furnace. Their faithfulness was not dependent on God's decision to rescue them. They had already decided that God was worthy of their obedience.

Real faith remains faithful in the fire. It does not wait for circumstances to improve before trusting God.

#### **Reflection Questions**

Is my faith dependent on favorable outcomes?

How can I remain faithful in the midst of uncertainty?

What does faithfulness look like in my current situation?

## **This Week's Application**

Continue trusting God while you wait.

Remain committed to God's ways during difficult seasons.

Let your faith be stronger than your circumstances.

## **Living It Out This Week**

Trust God's ability.

Accept God's decision.

Stay faithful through the fire.

---

## **Encouragement**

You may not know how your situation will turn out, but you do know who God is.

The same God who was with Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego in the furnace is with you today. Trust His power, trust His wisdom, and remain faithful.
